Zones of Regulation - Parent Meeting: Monday 23 May:

We would like to re-run our Zones of Regulation session with any parent who was unable to make the coffee morning that we held in March. This time it will be held after school starting at 3:30pm on **Monday 23 May**. The event will be an opportunity to learn more about the Zones of Regulation, which is something we have launched across school to support our children with learning about their emotions and supporting in finding ways to cope with these. The Zones are a fantastic way to get children talking about emotions and tools to help with emotional regulation and can also be talked about and utilised at home. We will be offering coffee and cake and some resources to talk home with you too. Please come along if you are available - everyone is welcome!

Here's a brief guide as to what the 'Zones' represent:

The ZONES of Regulation®

BLUE ZONE Sad Sick Tired Bored Moving Slowly	GREEN ZONE Happy Calm Feeling Okay Focused Ready to Learn	YELLOW ZONE Frustrated Worried Silly/Wiggly Excited Loss of Some Control	RED ZONE Mad/Angry Terrified Yelling/Hitting Elated Out of Control
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Photos in assembly

For safeguarding reasons, we ask that family members do not take photos or videos of their children during assemblies when parents and carers are invited. Any person doing this will be asked to delete pictures from their phone. This is standard practice in educational settings and is designed to protect the privacy and safety of pupils. We ensure that children can have an individual photo with loved ones at the end of the assembly.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: Free School Meals

If your child is in Reception, Y1 or Y2, they are eligible for Universal FSM but you can still apply if you think you are eligible for income-related free school meals. If your child is in Year 2 and receiving universal free school meals, please remember that this will stop when they move into Year 3 (when your child moves into Year 3, this means that unless you are entitled to FSM, they will no longer receive free school meals), so please ensure you have applied if you think you eligible. Please ask your class teacher or call into the school reception for an application form.
